Inès Benomar is an associate programme management officer at the United Nations Office for Disaster Risk Reduction (UNDRR), based in the New York Liaison Office. Her work bridges disaster risk reduction, climate adaptation, and resilience, advancing the integration of DRR into intergovernmental processes, national strategies and sustainable development for climate-vulnerable countries and those in special situations. She coordinates multistakeholder dialogues and thematic programming across major intergovernmental platforms—including the UNGA, LDCs, and the 2025 Global Platform on DRR—and leads UNDRR's contributions to global knowledge products on disaster risk governance, ocean resilience, and climate-disaster risk linkages. Before joining UNDRR, Benomar shaped international climate adaptation and loss & damage strategies as a Climate Diplomacy Policy Advisor at E3G, advising EU governments and climate-vulnerable coalitions within the UNFCCC. She has also worked with the European Commission's DG Climate Action, Ricardo Energy and Environment, and the UN Environment Programme, with earlier policy advisory work on adaptation and coastal resilience in Morocco and Tunisia. Benomar holds an MSc (Distinction) in environmental policy and regulation from the London School of Economics and a BA (Honours) in international development from King's College London. She is a published author on climate resilience, sovereign debt, and geopolitical risk, and speaks Italian, English, Spanish and French fluently.
