

Jorge R. Piñón

Jorge R. Piñón is currently associated with The University of Texas at Austin's Energy Institute. He is the former director of The University of Texas at Austin's Center for International Energy and Environmental Policy - Latin America and Caribbean Energy and Environmental Program. Mr. Piñón began his thirty-two-year career in the energy sector when he joined Shell Oil Company's supply and transportation organization. He was president and chief executive officer of Transworld Oil USA prior to joining Amoco Corporation as president of Amoco Corporate Development Company Latin America. He served as president of Amoco Oil de México and president of Amoco Oil Latin America, based in Mexico City. After the merger between Amoco and BP, Mr. Piñón was transferred to Madrid, Spain, to manage BP Europe's western Mediterranean petroleum supply and logistics operations. He is recognized as an independent analyst of regional energy issues, as well as the politics of oil and natural gas in Latin America. He has conducted research and country energy risk assessments as a Visiting Energy Fellow at the University of Miami's Center for Hemispheric Policy, Brookings Institution and Florida International University's Latin American and Caribbean Center; prior to joining The University of Texas at Austin. Mr. Piñón has testified on regional energy issues before committees of the U.S. Senate and U.S. House of Representatives. He holds a degree in Economics and a certificate in Latin American Studies from the University of Florida. He is recipient of the University of Florida's Center for Latin American Studies; "Alumni Lifetime Achievement Award" for promoting the sustainable development of energy resources in the region. He is a coauthor of *Cuba's Energy Future: Strategic Approaches to Cooperation* (Brookings 2010); and *Contemporary Cuba: The Post-Castro Era* (Rowman & Littlefield 2023).
